Summary of findings

Overall summary

Rathside Rest Home is registered to provide care and support for up to 32 people, some of whom are living with dementia. There were 30 people living in the service at the time of inspection. The service provides care in one adapted building over two floors with stair and lift access, the ground floor is used to support people living with dementia.

We found the following examples of good practice.

- The service was fully engaged with the Covid-19 testing and vaccination programmes. All staff and people were tested in-line with current guidance and vaccinations had been offered to people who wanted them.
- The service communicated with relatives to promote people's wellbeing. The service used technology to ensure people were supported to maintain relationships with their families and reduce social isolation.
- Visits were arranged in line with government guidance. A booking system was in place to ensure safe visiting. Personal protective equipment (PPE) and sanitiser available for visitors.
- Staff were seen to be following the current government guidance in relation to PPE and PPE stations were available at regular intervals around the home.

Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.

As part of the Care Quality Commission's (CQC) response to care homes with outbreaks of coronavirus, we are conducting reviews to ensure that the Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) practice was safe and the service was compliant with IPC measures. This was a targeted inspection looking at the IPC practices the provider has in place.

This inspection took place on 04 March 2021 and was announced.
