# Summary of findings

#### Overall summary

About the service

Springfield House Care Home accommodates up to 50 people with residential care needs in a purpose-built building. 33 people were using the service at the time of the inspection.

We found the following examples of good practice:

- Appropriate measures were in place at the entrance and in the home to reduce the risk of infection. Social distancing rules were being complied with. Some minor changes had been made to the layout of furniture to encourage and support social distancing.
- The provider was following national guidance for anyone moving into the home and admissions were carried out safely.
- Staff supported people's social and emotional wellbeing. People were supported to keep in touch with their family members via video or telephone calls. The provider and staff communicated regularly with family members about the latest guidance and to update on their relative's health.
- The provider and registered manager ensured staff received appropriate guidance and support. Staff had undertaken additional training in infection prevention and control and regular audits were carried out.
- Staffing levels had been maintained and supplemented with agency staff. Agency staff were appropriately trained and only worked at this service.

**Detailed findings** 

### Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.

We looked at infection prevention and control measures under the Safe key question. We look at this in all care home inspections even if no concerns or risks have been identified. This is to provide assurance that the service can respond to coronavirus and other infection outbreaks effectively. We also sought to identify examples of good practice in infection prevention and control.

This inspection visit took place on 28 October 2020 and was announced. Telephone conversations with staff members took place on 3 November 2020.
